Progress with projects

Dear Friends,

I must start with a huge **Thank You** to everyone who helped make **24-hour Music Marathon** such a great success – musicians, refreshment providers, all those who worked behind the scenes, and of course everyone who supported by attending different sessions in person or online and contributed so generously.

£2,710 was added to our funds and our profile was raised through the number of organisations who participated. It was great to see the church so well used.

Sunday teas are going exceptionally well again this year and helped by free live music on occasions, have already raised £1500. Teas will continue to the end of September, and we have more live music on **20**th **August** and **24**th **September**. (See below)

We launched the **new village hub** and **Websites** for the Friends, the Church and History Society in the village hall on May 20th with a good attendance, with many people staying for the whole afternoon. The new websites were demonstrated and there was lots of interest in the Photo Archive, the village trail, school local history panels and video tour of the church. We were also pleased to be part of **Shillingfest** on 24th June raising £142 on the raffle as well as supporting the church stalls. Next year we plan to run one or two activity stalls of our own to make the most of the opportunity Shillingfest presents.

Flying Teddies on 16th July was great fun, despite the windy weather preventing the use of the parachutes which might have taken the teddies far and wide! Lots of children enjoyed watching their soft toys whiz down on the invisible zip wire, and plenty of tea and cakes were consumed, raising another £445.

After great progress with our **restoration work** last year, completing the West Wall project and a section of the churchyard wall, we have been held up this year waiting for grant outcomes and then for stonemasons who can only work with lime mortar in the summer months. We are still hoping to do the next section of **the churchyard wall** this summer, as well as some smaller repairs to stonework and plaster, and to see some further repairs to the lead roof. Restoring the **stone arch over the North Door** will now be next year but the stonemasons will start indoor work on cutting the stones during the winter.
