
## **SUMMER NEWSLETTER 2024** Events and Progress with projects



Dear Friends,

This is my first newsletter as Chairman of the Friends and I would like to start by paying tribute to Peter Lambert for all that he has done for the Friends over many years. I see it as my role to continue Peter's good work and also to look at new ways we can generate income both for the essential maintenance work and the improvements to the Church we would like to undertake.

Many of you will have seen the **repairs to the churchyard wall** which have been completed over the last couple of years. We hope to complete a further section late this year. The next project, however, is to the church itself, with **work due to begin on the north door** later this month. The door arch is very badly eroded and in urgent need of attention. I will be updating the Friends' website with before, during and after photos so that everyone can see exactly how the vital funds are being spent.

So, on to events. We started the year with a very successful **skittles event**. It was another sold out event, proving its continuing popularity, and was enjoyed by all.

We then had a very enjoyable **AGM**, the highlight of which was an enthralling and inspiring talk by Andrew Elliman. It turns out that cycling down Church Street on a penny farthing bicycle, whilst 'exciting' enough for most mortals, is as nothing compared with his many other exploits. Andrew has promised to give a full version of his talk as a fundraiser for the Friends. The date and venue are tbc at the moment, but once I have the details I will let you all know and would strongly encourage people to come along and hear a truly remarkable story.

Next up is Shillingfest on Saturday the 29<sup>th</sup> of June. We plan to have a much larger presence this year. As well as our 'traditional' raffle, there will be a Tin Can Alley and a Human Fruit Machine! I appreciate that

many people are already involved in activities during the day, but if anybody is free to help out at one of our stalls and/or could supply a raffle prize, I would be delighted to hear from you.

**Sunday Teas** are already going strong and will continue each Sunday from 3pm to 5pm until the end of September. Huge thanks to all bakers, helpers and all who come and enjoy Sunday afternoons there. It is a useful income stream but, more importantly, a great place to meet up and keep the church busy and active.
