Progress on restoration projects

Dear Friends,

I'm delighted to let you know that a vicar has been appointed to serve the new joint benefice of Shillington, Stondon, Arlesey and Astwick. Rev Jenna Dearden, who is currently completing her curacy in Dunstable will start with us at the end of July. We wish her well in the role and will look forward to welcoming her to some of our events.

We have continued our run of 'sold out' events with the very successful 70s vinyl disco (which raised £1,462) in November, and the Skittles night in the village hall on 5th February. We are hugely appreciative of all your support including your membership donations which underpin our grant applications. The Crown Public House also kindly donated £175 entry fees from their latest Quiz night towards the next section of the Churchyard wall.

Special thanks are due to Zoe Glenister who has made a donation of £4,300 in memory of her husband Paul who died last year. Paul had a strong interest in ancient buildings, and All Saints in particular, and was a firm supporter of the Friends. We are most grateful.

The Friends Committee members once again provided a Christmas Tree for the village, encouraging donations to Herts Young Homeless. This year was more eventful than usual with the tree twice being blown over by the high winds! We thought the heavy base and spike into the ground would be sufficient, but had to anchor it even more securely – a lesson for next time!

Restoration and Maintenance projects:

Along with the never-ending **repairs to the roof** to tackle the latest leaks, in the Autumn we completed restoration of another section of **the graveyard wall** between the 9 steps and the main path up to the church. This year we will do the next section down to the Yew tree which is suffering badly with stones falling out.

The stonemasons have started to prepare the shaped blocks needed to repair **the stone arch over the North Door.** We are waiting to hear the outcome of our application to the National Churches Trust before work on site begins when the weather allows.

A new need has been identified to repair cracks in **the arch above the 'bellringers' window** (the one with the ringing charts in the stained glass). Our list of projects is always long, and we are eternally grateful for your support!
